Challenges of Current Literature-Visualization Tools


- 1. Dependent on **small**, **outdated** manually curated paper datasets
- 2. Lack support for **personalized** exploration



Argo Scholar queries and visualizes

Semantic Scholar's ~200 million papers.

Users construct and display personalized literature exploration results as graphs of papers (nodes) connected by citation relations (edges).



2 Shareable Literature Graphs

Users can share snapshots of literature exploration visualization on the cloud for free, accessible from anywhere via URLs.

A JSON snapshot that stores the information of explored papers and their connections can be embedded in Jupyter Notebook or HTML IFrames.

3 Incremental Exploration

Argo Scholar supports incremental associative sensemaking, a common and effective method to discover relevant work.


Users grow a network of related papers by iteratively adding citations or references via *Literature Exploration Dropdown*.

Evaluation with Observation Study



Incremental exploration works well across disciplines
